HITACHI ZH210 HYBRID

In partnership with Hitachi we have deployed capital in 21t hybrid excavators to reduce our carbon footprint and save on fuel costs. To date, the hybrid excavators use up to 34% less fuel while emitting 33% less CO2.



SANY SY215E

SANY is a leading multinational heavy equipment manufacturer that has released its first medium-sized e-excavator outside China. With a rated battery capacity of 422 kWh and a battery life of 5 to 7 hours, Delta Group has placed an order with Australian distribution partners to purchase the SY215E electric excavator.



Carbon Management

We aspire to play an active role in Australia's transition to Net Zero emissions by 2050.

To help inform our own emissions reduction targets, as well as to meet our (and our client's) obligations under the Australian Government NGER Scheme, Delta Group has established an emissions monitoring and reporting system encompassing our diversified contracting services.

We currently monitor and report on Scope 1 and Scope 2 emissions, with ongoing development of Scope 3 emissions monitoring in step with government policy settings.

Resource Recovery

Delta Group is one of the largest processors of C&D waste streams in Australia and diverts more than 2m tonnes from landfill each year.

We are at the forefront of 21st century treatments and technologies that reduce our reliance on finite virgin construction materials by turning C&D waste streams into high quality, high value and custom engineered building materials.

All Delta Group sites operate under approved conditions which maintain the highest level of quality control for incoming materials, reprocessing and finished product sales.

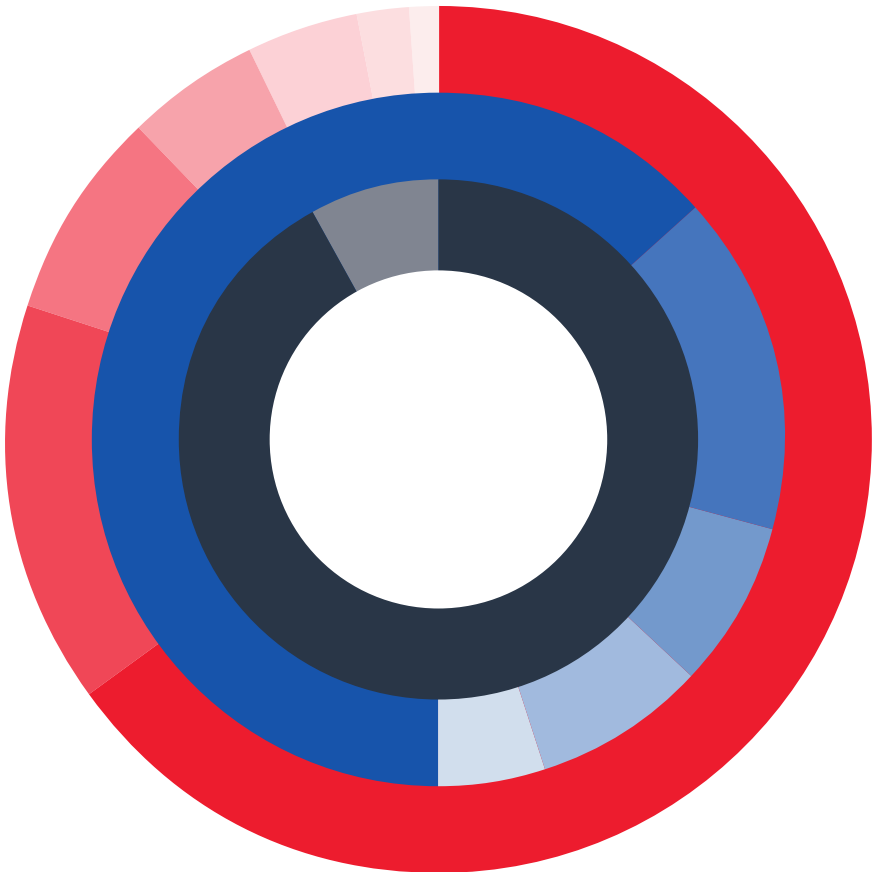
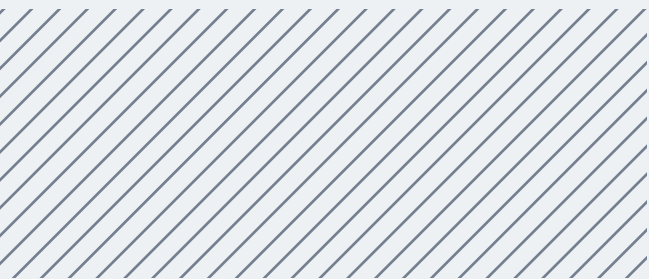

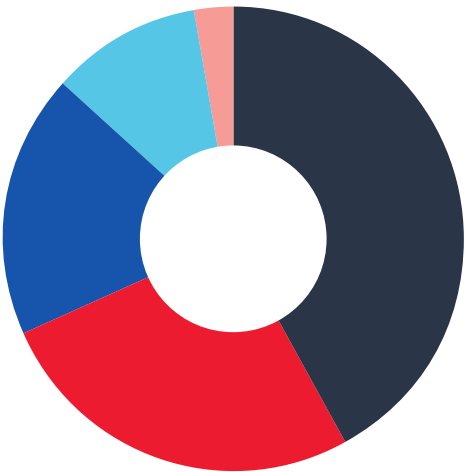

With a mission to provide long term Aboriginal job prospects and trade apprenticeships, as well as to provide clients with a practical and meaningful pathway for engaging Aboriginal Australians and small Aboriginal businesses - Widi Ngaruwa offers civil, demolition and remediation services in Western Australia and South Australia.

Widi Ngaruwa means “Black Duck” in the language of the Wajarri people and tells the story of (Director) Robby Mallard and his journey and continued growth as an Aboriginal business owner. Through consultation with the Elders and Community, Robby was granted the use of these Wajarri words to represent the business.

The logo is a contemporary interpretation of an artwork created for Robby, by Yamatji woman, Loretta Egan. At the heart of the brand is the “Black Duck” – symbolic of vigilance, protection, balance, adaptation and strength. It is simplistic in its application and the design showcases movement. Widi Ngaruwa is in flight; powerful and commanding attention.

The three feathers (in the logo) are also a shout-out to Delta Group, representing the enabling strength of the alliance in achieving business growth, Aboriginal economic empowerment, and the Widi Ngaruwa mission.



Flicker of Hope Foundation

In August 2018, Delta Group joined the Petropoulos Family as a foundation partner of the Flicker of Hope Foundation.

Flicker of Hope was established to support the Murdoch Children’s Research Institute in Melbourne, Victoria, and to raise funds for research into new and more effective treatments for Neurofibromatosis (NF).

NF is a debilitating genetic disorder that can cause tumours, cancer, epilepsy, disfigurement, blindness and learning difficulties, including autism. One in 2,500 people are affected and there is no cure.

The Flicker of Hope Foundation has been inspired by Zoe Petropoulos who was diagnosed with NF at just four months of age.

Zoe loves to dream big and she dreams of a bright future for all those affected by NF.

In 2018 Zoe and the Petropoulos family established The Flicker of Hope Foundation to raise much needed funds to support researchers in their quest to find positive treatments and improve the quality of life for those impacted by NF.

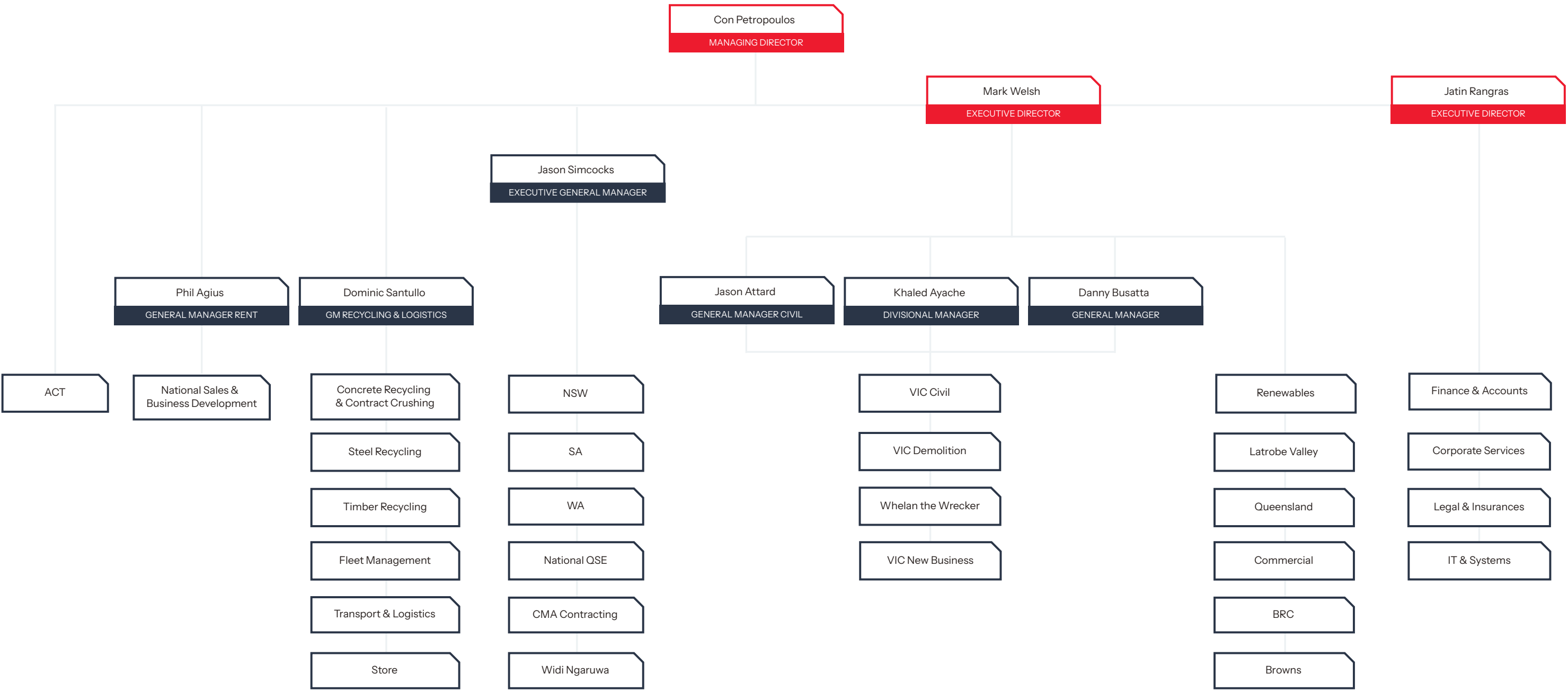

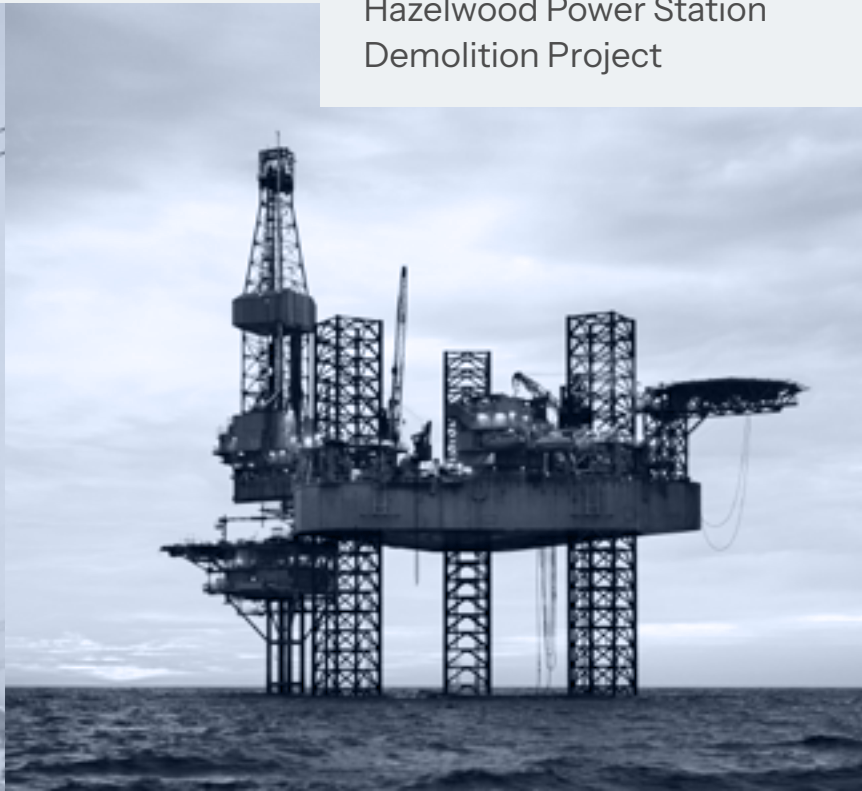
